ANNUAL MEETING

The annual meeting of Country Roads Cyclists was held at Panera Breads in Clarksburg Saturday, October 23 (See by-laws posted online at crcyclists.org in archives.) Secretary Bill Foster reported current membership at 138 (48 individual, 45 x2 family) including 40 Harrison, 48 Monongalia, 6 Marion, 29 other W.Va. and 15 out-of-state including 19 new and 1 returning. (2009 total136) He also noted the new "Archives" section with items from older newsletters, including early history of CRC as the Harrison County Bicycle Assn., a history of the Appalachian Spring Spectacular, and past newsletters from 2007 in color (including Bruce's Asian tour).

Treasurer Foster indicated a current balance of \$1,365 with about \$100 anticipated expenses remaining for the year, with income almost exactly equal to expenses.

Ken Parkington discussed results of his survey through crcyclists@google.com and asked for ideas for getting members riding together outside the regular schedule. Bill Foster noted and commended the recent activities of the Morgantown Bike Board. President Williams thanked all involved for the work on the Club website and e-mail system. Susan advocated that persons who join the Club before November 1 would be joining for the balance of the current year, but not both years for single year dues.

New officers were elected unanimously as follows: President Ken Parkington, Vice-President/Road Captain Kelly Williams, Secretary/Treasurer Bill Foster.

OFICERS' MEETING

Club officers met October 18 at the Blue Moose Cafe in Morgantown, with new president Ken Parkington presiding and five Morgantown area members attending. Secretary Foster indicated a current membership of 141. He was directed that dues from new members submitted prior to November 1 should be credited for current year membership only. Treasurer Foster indicated a balance of \$1,349.45. Members are welcome to attend any officers' meeting. Contact any officer.

Discussion of President Parkington's survey included a decision to include a "hard copy opt-out" on the 2011 dues form. It was agreed that unscheduled rides that did not conflict with a scheduled ride (nearby location/same type ride) could be encouraged and members could announce them on crcyclists@gmail. Other Club activities, past and future, were reviewed and discussed. Frank expressed appreciation for Bill Foster's years of work for the Club and cycling. Bill Foster expressed appreciation for Morgantown Bicycle Board efforts (Frank Gmeindl, chairman) for improving cycling in the Morgantown area.

CRC SEPTEMBER CENTURY

Sixteen members and eight guests participated in our September Century ride from Salem to New Martinsville for brunch at Barista's and back on a beautiful day for a bike ride. Several opted for shorter distances, turning around at several places along the way. Among six members participating for the first time, Dave noted (ed.): "I would like to thank all involved in making my first club century a good one. From the folks I rode with, to the beautiful weather and the nice folks at Barista's... and especially Bill Foster for taking his time to man the rest stops and do sag. THE MORGANTOWN BICYCLE BOARD WORKS FOR A BICYCLE - FRIENDLY COMMUNITY

The Morgantown Bicycle Board, an advisory committee to the Morgantown Traffic Commission, has been diligently working for several years to make Morgantown a more bicycle-friendly community where "All Morgantown residents can enjoy bicycling safely and fearlessly anywhere, anytime, for any reason." (Vision statement online) The twenty member board, which includes several Country Roads Cyclists as well as other community leaders and officials, is also aiming for "Bicycle Friendly Community" status from the League of American Bicyclists. Funding for several projects has come from various sources, including a grant from WVDOH through the Transportation Enhancements

Program as well as City of Morgantown and other local monies.

Much of the work of the Committee can be seen on their website, BikeMorgantown.com, where a new Morgantown Bicycle Route map is posted, along with other projects and plans.

Since April 2010, bicycling education articles have been published in the *Dominion Post*, generally on the last Thursday each month and posted on BikeMorgantown.com .

Among the more visible projects are the new bicycle parking rings, most attached to meter posts on High and Walnut Streets downtown. (Bicycle parking is free and allows secure locking.)

West Virginia University information kiosks located at PRT stations, the Mountainlair and other campus sites also display varying video clips as described below (at right):



The Confident City Cycling program, developed from the League of American Bicyclists' Smart Cycling, has offered frequent courses to cyclists over the past three years, with five League Certified Instructors (all CRC members) teaching 64 students.

A Driver Education course entitled Share the Road, has been developed and presented to one of the three Monongalia County school driver education instructors for use in County high schools.

A full-page bicycling education "community page" has been prepared for the 2011 Mountaineer Yellow Pages (listing crcyclists.org - thank you.). Among



- Seven 15 second educational messages were developed and are being brodcast on Comcast and Morgantown public access channel 15 and can be found on youtube.
- An electronic billboard was developed and displayed in September and October, 2010 on WV Rt. 119 heading north from Mileground Road, and six other messages will be developed in the coming months and displayed in the spring on two electronic billboards located on the Star City Bridge and the Mileground.

Bumper stickers promoting "Share the Road" are available in Morgantown bike shops, City Hall and several other locations.



other items are "Before you head out, follow the ABC Quick Check." and "Five Steps to Riding Better" from the LAB, offering: "Follow the rules of the road, Be visible, Be predictable, Anticipate conflicts, and Wear a helmet."

BED AND BREAKFASTS ACROSS THE UNITED STATES TO HONOR U.S. MILITARY VETS ON VETERANS DAY

Kathleen Panek, Shinnston member and owner of Gillum House Bed and Breakfast, may be the Anna Jarvis for vets. Jay Karen writes online for the Professional Association of Innkeepers International, * This is the year that Kathleen Panek, owner of the Gillum House B&B in Shinnston, West Virginia, took a local idea and made it international. Through the West Virginia Bed and Breakfast Association in 2009, Kathleen breathed life into the campaign that had innkeepers giving complimentary rooms to U.S. military veterans in honor of Veterans Day. This year, participating B&Bs in "B&Bs for Vets" are donating at least one room on the night of Wednesday, November 10th (night before Veterans' Day)to any active duty or retired veterans. "

Kathleen came up with the "B&Bs for Vets" idea two years ago, and started by offering a gratis night at her own B&B. The program branched out to 10West Virginia inns last year and now, aided, in part, by a marketing assist from TripAdvisor.com, it grew to about 900 Inns (mostly in the US, but one in Paris, about a dozen in Canada and a few in other countries, too).

Kathleen, whose grandson in the Navy is serving in Afghanistan, decided her personal expression of gratitude could also be good for business. "But the main object is to say thank you to the veterans." she said.



In addition to recognition from the Shinnston city Council and articles on the AP wire, USA Today, Army Times, MSNBC, CBS news, The Wall Street Journal and many other media outlets, she will be going to Charleston, S.C. in January to receive a national award as one of three innkeepers designated "Champions of the Year."

ABBATE WINS IN WORLDS

Gary Abbate, Bridgeport member also likes to swim, and he is good at it. In addition to being assistant coach for the Bridgeport High School swim team for eight years, during which time they won two state team titles, he did the "Escape from Alcatraz" triathlon and won two golds in the National Senior Olympics.

His most recent triumph was at the Huntsman World Senior Games in Utah in October where he won fastest overall time among all competitors doing the 100m breast stroke in 1:20.55 and in his 55-59 age group placing 1st in 3:01.44 for fastest overall time among all competitors in the 200m breast stroke. Other placings among over 200 swimmers were:
